

Phlebotomy Certificate

The phlebotomy certificate program introduces a variety of phlebotomy techniques in order to obtain quality specimens that lead to quality results. Anatomy and physiology, medical terminology, medical abbreviations, laboratory safety, personal safety, laboratory environment, laboratory equipment, OSHA and CLIA regulations will be emphasized.

The phlebotomy certificate program is currently offered at the Leestown campus every fall semester and at the Danville campus every spring semester. PHB 100 is offered during the evening hours and typically consists of 12 classroom/laboratory hours per week for the first half of the semester. PHB 155 is typically offered during daytime hours and consists of 180 clinical externship hours for the second half of the semester. PHB 100 requires a minimum grade of C before progressing to PHB 155. Excellent attendance and reliable transportation are essential for success in this program.
