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Project LIFE is a program designed to assist participants (ages 18-21) who were previously committed to state's custody eliminate all barriers to being self-sufficient, including: obtaining housing for a year, completing educational goals, obtaining employment, and life skills training. Young adults who participate in the program must be able to live independently, understand and follow rules of Project LIFE, and adhere to the rules of the property in which they rent. The lease and responsibilities of the rental agreement are between the property owner and the young adult. The young adult is expected to be moving toward self-sufficiency. All referrals are assessed and each are screened on individual basis by a member of the Project LIFE team prior to being accepted into the program. We will look at mental health levels, criminal activity and overall willingness to work towards goal in the program.
