Additional Information

- A letter grade of "C" or higher is required for each nursing course, each biological/physical science course, and any qualifying math course.
- Non-NSG course(s) must be taken prior to or concurrent with the semester sequence in which the student is enrolling in nursing.
- Successful completion of each nursing course in each semester is required before one may progress to the next semester of the program.
- A cumulative grade point average of 2.5 must be met in order to apply and then maintained after admission to the nursing program.
- Failure to complete the delineated sequencing of the courses and curriculum will result in withdrawal from the program.
- The Associates Degree Nursing Program is a total of 71 credit hours excluding Pre-Requisites listed above.

Selective Admission: Associate Degree Nursing (RN)

The process for applying is a “Complete Application Packet” format. Students must submit all documents by the date specified on the BCTC web site in order to be considered for admission. Only complete packets will be processed and considered for the program.

- Create a Selective Admissions System (SAS) account at <https://legacy.bluegrass.kctcs.edu/forms/sas/login.php>
- Once you have created a Selective Admission System account you may begin assembling your application packet by printing off the program checklist and gathering the required documents. Once complete, you will return your packet to one of several locations:
 - The Office of Admissions (Cooper Campus) 119 Oswald Building
 - The One Stop Student Service Center (Leestown Campus), Building C
 - The Lawrenceburg campus
 - The Danville campus
 - The packet may also be mailed, but please ensure that you have adequate postage. Packets must be postmarked by the published deadline in order to be considered for admission.

- **You must submit the checklist with your packet.** Gather all of the documents required from the checklist for consideration to the Associate Degree Nursing (ADN) program and place them in one envelope.
- Official high school transcript (**for current high school students only**). Transcript **must** show a date of graduation.
- Official scores of the *NLN PAX-RN* exam. Must be current within 3 years.
- Official transcripts of all post-secondary education attempted. Transcripts must be submitted from EACH college or university previously attended and must show every period of enrollment. Transcripts from the *Kentucky Community and Technical College* System do **not** need to be submitted.
- In order to be considered for admission to the Associate Degree Nursing (RN) Program, each applicant must attend a mandatory pre-admission conference with the Program Coordinator. **Submit signed attendance form with your packet.** Please follow the link for conference dates:
